Classroom News

Junior Infants: We've had a very exciting week in Junior Infants. Over the last few weeks we have had some visitors in our classroom; caterpillars that our now butterflies. We watched them grow, build their cocoons and transform into butterflies. We had a very exciting Thursday afternoon as we released the butterflies into the beautiful outdoors. We've enjoyed learning all about the life cycle and observed each stage closely. This week we all brought in a photo of ourselves when we were babies and explored how we have grown and changed.
