## School Fees 2025 / 2026

Dear parents/guardians,

As you may be aware the Department of Education has continued the Free School Books Grant Scheme to all primary schools for 2025-26 maintaining payment at the same rate as last year. This grant scheme provides school books, workbooks and copy books free of charge to all pupils. This is extremely positive news and progress from the Government and is a most welcome support to all pupils and their families.

Based on the information and arrangements communicated to schools for the next academic year 2025/26, the school will purchase all books, workbooks & copy books for our pupils from this grant. These free books, workbooks & copy books will be supplied, name labelled and ready to go to all of our pupils on our return for the new school year 2025/26.

Whilst the grant is most welcomed, it unfortunately will not cover the cost of all pupil requirements. Therefore, we are asking for a contribution payment of €70 per child. This payment represents a small increase on previous years to cover the increased cost of items being purchased using this money. This will go towards the cost of the following additional items to support teaching and learning:

Copying & Paper

• Pupil stationery -book box, pencil case and all stationery requirements (pencils, rubbers sharpeners, crayons, marla, colours, pens, glue sticks, mini whiteboards, rulers, scissors, geometry sets & calculators)

• Art & Craft Materials & Classroom resources -Paints, pastels, clay, brushes, glue, all paper, card etc...

• Online resources and IT support resources

• Pupil Personal Insurance this covers each pupil for 24 hours personal accident insurance for 365 days from the beginning of the school year, both in and out of school.

We would ask that this **payment of €70 be made by Friday 5th July** as most items will have already been ordered and paid for by the school by then.

Please note that books previously part of the book rental scheme will continue to be used as part of this scheme and we ask that these are returned to the school ASAP so that we can prepare and pass these on to next year's classes. Many thanks for those already returned and your support in this regard.
